REGINA, Sask. — March 18, 2026 — Canada's Farm Show Regina, SK, presented by Bunge, kicked off yesterday at REAL District.

Over 300 exhibits fill the Bunge International Trade Centre, Banner Hall, and the Avana Centre. International guests are from as far away as Australia and the Dominican Republic.
