Canada's Farm Show Regina, SK Draws Global Exhibitors, Showcases Innovation, Industry Collaboration

Regina, Sask. – March 27, 2026 – Canada's Farm Show Regina, Sask., presented by Bunge, drew farmers, exhibitors and industry leaders from across Canada and several international markets for three days of programming focused on innovation and collaboration in agriculture.

Organizers reported the 2026 event featured a sold-out tradeshow with **more than 300 exhibits and recorded more than 5,500 scanned attendees**. Expanded space and a growing exhibitor waitlist reflect continued demand for the annual event.

"Canada's Farm Show continues to prove why it's a cornerstone event for agriculture—not just in Saskatchewan, but on the global stage," said **Trent Fraser, Acting President and CEO of the Regina Exhibition Association Ltd. (REAL)**. "The strength of our agricultural sector is on full display here, driven by innovation, forward-thinking ideas, and meaningful collaboration. When you bring together leaders, producers, and innovators from around the world, you create an environment where real conversations happen and real progress is made."

"This is more than an event, it's a place to do business, build relationships, and spark partnerships that move agriculture forward," add Fraser. "We're incredibly grateful to our key sponsors, Bunge and Deloitte, for their leadership and commitment to advancing agriculture in Saskatchewan and beyond."

The show also hosted international exhibitors and guests from countries including the United States, Ethiopia, Kazakhstan, Morocco, Italy, the Dominican Republic and Australia.

As in past years, Canada's Farm Show delivered significant economic benefits to Regina and area through increased hotel bookings, dining and local business activity.

The event featured strong messages of support from all levels of government including Lt.-Gov. Bernadette McIntyre, Premier Scott Moe, Agriculture Minister David Marit. **Premier Scott Moe**



formally opened the show at the Thank You Farmers Breakfast on March 17, highlighting the role of Saskatchewan agriculture in the provincial and world economy.

Education was a priority for this year's show. The Launch Pad, presented by Deloitte, hosted 16 sessions covering topics such as agricultural safety, mental health, global markets, artificial intelligence and public policy. Sessions brought together producers, policymakers and industry representatives.

It was also announced that, through the generosity of Bunge and the City of Regina, the Brandtner Murals, painted by Fritz Brandtner and commissioned for the 1933 World Grain Exhibition in Regina, will have a permanent home at REAL District.
